### Scrap Metal and Bulky Waste Collection

Please separate the piles between scrap metal and bulky waste  
Only put out at the curb the week before the schedule pickup dates.

April 20-24 and November 2-6

November 30 - December 4

## Unacceptable Waste

Tires • Construction Waste • Grass Clippings

Other large machinery related items may not be placed at curb side at any time.

## Household Hazardous Waste

Aerosols , antifreeze, bathroom cleaners, batteries, brake fluid , bug sprays, chemical fertilizer, cleaners, contaminated waste oil, disinfectants, drain cleanser, dry cleaning solvents, floor care products, furniture polish, fungicides, gasoline, herbicides, insecticides, metal polish, moth balls, oven cleaners, oil paints, paint strippers, thinners, transmission fluid, pool and photography chemicals, and fluorescent bulbs.

**New Recycling bins may be purchased at the Town Manager's Office at the Town Hall for \$10.00 or at the North Branford Paper Recycling Center on the first Saturday of every month from 9AM – noon.**





## PUT YOUR RECYCLING BIN CURBSIDE EVERY WEEK

The following items should be placed together in the curbside recycling bin:

All food containers ( glass, plastic, or metal) should be rinsed clean. **Discard lids, caps, and corks.**

Labels do **not** need to be removed.

What to Recycle	How to Recycle	What NOT to Recycle
<b>Glass:</b> Food and beverage containers, clear, green, brown bottles and jars	No broken glass	Light bulbs, mirrors, window plate glass, white/opal glass, Pyrex, pottery, ceramics
<b>Metal:</b> Food and beverage containers only - aluminum, tin, steel, or some combination	Rinse clean	Aerosol cans, paint cans, coat hangers
<b>Grayboard:</b> Cereal, cracker, egg cartons, shoe boxes, gift boxes, shirt cardboard, paper roll cores, cookie boxes without foil interiors or cellophane windows	Flatten	
<b>Aseptic:</b> juice boxes, orange juice container, tomato sauce, broth and soup	Flatten	
<b>Plastic Containers:</b> All plastic containers must have one of the following symbols stamped on the bottom 	Flatten and rinse clean	Plastic bags, plastic plant containers
<b>Newspapers</b> (including any inserts) <b>Magazines and Catalogues</b> <b>Junk mail</b>	Place in brown paper grocery bags or tie with string.	Telephone books (special container outside the North Branford Paper Recycling Center)
<b>Corrugated Cardboard</b> Cross section of corrugated cardboard: (pieces cannot exceed 2'x4') 	Flatten boxes, remove styrofoam or other packing material, tie with string	Pizza boxes Wax coated corrugated cardboard

### DEFINITIONS

**Household Batteries :** any battery used for normal household use, i.e., AA, AAA, C, D, 9 volt, and hearing aid

**Batteries from Vehicles:** lead acid batteries or any from motor vehicles

**Scrap Metal and Bulky Waste: (April 20-24 and November 2-6)** Air-conditioners, metal lawn furniture, large appliances (refrigerators, with doors removed), hot water tanks, tools, metal fencing, filing cabinets, furnaces, garbage pails, non-riding lawn mowers and riding mowers less than 10hp with gas removed, microwaves, outdoor grills, small machines, aluminum siding. *(Please note scrap metal and bulky waste can not be placed at the curb until the week before your scheduled date).*

**Bulky Waste:** couches, mattresses, rugs, wooden furniture, picnic tables, wood storm windows. Tree limbs, branches and scrap wood all need to **be less than 4' long and no thicker than 4" and need to be bundled and tied.** No TV's, VCR's, DVD's, computers, or scrap vehicle parts.
