## MINUTES OF WATER POLLUTION CONTROL AUTHORITY & TOWN COUNCIL MEETINGS OF NORTH BRANFORD, CONNECTICUT

Mayor Anthony Candelora called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.

### SALUTE TO THE FLAG

1. ROLL CALL: Present were Mayor Anthony Candelora, Deputy Mayor Alfred Rose, Councilor Rose Angeloni, Councilor Michael Doody, Councilor Andrew Esposito, Councilor Joseph Faughnan, Councilor Joanne Wentworth. Also present were Town Manager Richard V. Branigan and Town Attorney John Gesmonde.

ABSENT: Councilor Donald Fucci, II  
Councilor Vincent Caprio arrived at 7:05 p.m.

2. Minutes of Previous Meeting:

a. January 03, 2012 –WPCA & Town Council Meeting.

MOTION: Councilor Angeloni moved, seconded by Councilor Faughnan to accept the minutes of the January 03, 2012 WPCA & Town Council Meeting.

VOTE: Passed 7-0 in a roll call vote with one abstention.

ABSTAIN: Councilor Esposito

3. Reports of Committees, Boards and Commissions:

a. Finance Sub-Committee-Councilor Angeloni reported that the committee met last Wednesday. One item discussed was the estimate on the STW conversion. The recommended quote came in at \$175,000 which will take up most of the steep grant. Another item discussed was sanitary sewers. The town engineer will bring suggestions to the next council meeting. Current bids that are presently out are an RFP for demolition of Amato's, Architect for continuance of the high school roof and the printing of tax bills.

b. Hazardous Waste/Recycling Committee- Town manager reported that the committee met last Thursday night. There was good discussion with representatives of John's Refuse with a focus on what can be done to improve recycling at the schools to improve environmental issues and cost savings for the town. There was also discussion regarding a solid waste committee, which will be included in tonight's meeting.

c. Economic Development Commission- The town manager reported that the commission discussed having a joint meeting with the chamber, business owners, realtors and other pertinent business people sometime in March. The town managers office will give support to this meeting.

d. Permanent Project Building Committee- Councilor Angeloni reported that the committee met last week with regards to the STW Project. They did not act on anything at this meeting as they are awaiting quotes from Salimone and Associates to get the project moving.

MOTION: Councilor Wentworth moved, seconded by Councilor Esposito to amend the agenda to include the Fire Department under Boards and Commissions, item e.

VOTE: Passed 8-0 in a roll call vote.

e. Fire Department- Mayor Candelora reported on the meeting held on January 5<sup>th</sup>. They had their election of officers which included Mr. Joe Civitello as Chair, Angelo Tosi as Vice Chair and Diane Whalen as clerk. They discussed the purchase of 12 refurbished pagers and that the Vintech Contract will be expiring around June 30, 2012. Ed Boughton was present and gave a presentation on some of the equipment.

#### 4. Town Manager's Report:

NBHS Roof Project- The town is in the process of putting together the request for Architectural Services.

NBIS – There continues to be building envelope issues, they are awaiting word from the building official regarding final items that need to be done for the CO. One of the biggest issues to resolve is the main lobby door.

Swajchuk and Wall Field.- The town met again with the representatives of Nafis and Young along with the Public Works Director and the town engineer to overview the revised drawings. Nafis and Young will be invited to an upcoming council meeting for an updated presentation.

STW Project – is moving forward, the updated information from Salimone and Associates was just received by the town.

Narrow Banding with the Police Department- There needs to be some research as to how the town will implement the requirements from the State.

Branford has received the firefighters grant, which was co-written by North Branford. Our volunteer departments will participate in the training from this grant.

Parks and Recreation will be looking at a revised draft outline for town parks. The town manager will be reviewing this draft with the Park and Recreation Commission.

A memo from the Police Chief came in recently informing the town manager that there will be a retirement from Phyllis Dunphy this year.

5. Community Events and Presentations:
  - a. Presentation of Town's Audit- Levitsky & Berney, P.C.

David Cappelletti of Levitsky & Berney gave an overview of the audit done by the Accounting firm of Levitsky & Berney, P.C. touching on specific items within the audit with explanations on some of the financial statements. There were numerous questions and comments by council members as to protocol and practices of the town. Mr. Cappelletti answered all questions.

6. Citizens' Statements, Petitions and Correspondence:
  - a. Letter (via email) from Jim Dwyer (dated December 30, 2011) (attachment 1)  
Mayor Candelora read an email letter from Jim Dwyer giving recognition to the town council, Joe Tenzar, for his inspiration and Fran Merola and his public works crew for doing such a great job.

- b. Letter (via email) from Scott Schoonmaker (dated January 11, 2012) (attachment 2)  
re: NBHS 5 year Graduation Data

Mayor Candelora acknowledged an email letter from Scott Schoonmaker thanking the council for attending a recent meeting and acknowledging the joint work of the council and board of education.

Cliff Potter of 1251 Middletown Avenue remarked on the importance of building economic development in town, mentioning specific issues when the Northford Ice Pavillion tried to expand their business.

Roger Munck of Walnut Lane reminded the council that he will be meeting with the town manager regarding the senior tax relief and invited some of the council members to attend. He also expressed his interest in being part of the Town Charter Revision Committee.

Ken Neubig of 180 Village Street expressed his concerns on the way the bidding process runs on small jobs in town. He asked for an explanation on how the process works and was given an explanation by the town manager. He made suggestions on how to expedite the small jobs in town.

7. Resignations and Appointments:
  - a. Appoint Liaisons to Boards and Commissions

MOTION: Deputy Mayor Rose moved, seconded by Councilor Angeloni for Councilor Doody to represent the council on the Board of Fire Commissioners.

VOTE: Passed 7-0 in a roll call vote with one abstention.

ABSTAIN: Councilor Doody

MOTION: Councilor Wentworth moved, seconded by Councilor Caprio to appoint Deputy Mayor Rose to serve as Chairman for the Finance Committee.

VOTE: Passed 7-0 in a roll call vote with one abstention.

ABSTAIN: Deputy Mayor Rose

- 8. Unfinished Business- Discussion and Action Re:
  - a. North Branford High School Roof Project

The town manager gave an explanation of how the town is going forward towards the next phase of the Roof Project with regard to expenditures.

b. Charter Revision

MOTION: Councilor Wentworth moved, seconded by Councilor Faughnan to resolve that the Town Council of the Town of North Branford, in accordance with Section 7-188(b) of the Connecticut General Statutes, establishes a Charter Revision Commission to consist of 7 members.

VOTE: Passed 8-0 in a roll call vote.

- 9. New Business - Discussion and Action Re:
  - a. CT Project No. 98-93 (Route 80 and 139)

The town manager reported that when contacting the state regarding attendance at the next council meeting, the state would rather meet informally. The council decided that as long as the North Branford Congregational Church is kept apprised regarding their issues, the council is comfortable with any meeting arrangements.

b. Municipal Solid Waste/Recycling Sub-Committee

MOTION: Councilor Wentworth moved, seconded by Deputy Mayor Rose to accept the proposed motion; The Town Council hereby appoints the following individuals to serve on the Municipal Solid Waste/Recycling Sub-Committee and that said committee provide a report to the Town Council no later than February 29, 2012. The two people to be appointed are Mary Bigelow from the Hazardous Waste Committee and Tom Scelfo along with Councilor Michael Doody.

VOTE: Passed 8-0 in a roll call vote.

e. Proposed Budget Preparation Schedule FY 2012-13 – Proposed Motion

MOTION: Councilor Doody moved, seconded by Councilor Angeloni to accept the Proposed motion; Be it hereby resolved that the North Branford Town Council approves the Proposed Budget Preparation Schedule for FY 2012-13. (attachment 3)

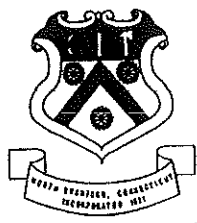
